HE marked difference in the attitude of the United States and the German gov enments towards trade and industrial combinations will be seen by comparing the German cartel system with the trade commission law recently enacted by Congress, and with other national and state legislation in restraint of monopoly and the avowed object of promoting free competition. Industrial and trade combinations in Germany are called cartels. There were, up to the outbreak of the war, more than r,000 cartels in operation in German-y, representing practically every line of business. The avowed object of the cartel was to lessen or eliminate competition. Prices, either of buying or selling, were fixed by mutual agreement. Cartels are either purchasing or selling agreements, and are subscribed to by manufacturers and dealers both in the jobbing and retail trade. The avowed object was to maintain prices upon a profitable basis for all parties concerned. They might be likened to the former gentlemen s agreements among the railroad presidents for the maintenance of rates, or to the tacit assent to price schedules in the steel trade said to have been reached at the Gary dinners--only the German cartels were more specific and had more sanction of law and authority. The attitude of the German government towards the cartels was shown in principle by the fact that the courts...
